THE UNIVERSE OF AMERICAN CRIME NOVELS AND FILMS: A PSYCHOANALYTICAL APPROACH

The aim of the project is to develop a psychoanalytical theory of a special segment of American popular culture: the universe of crime novels and films, exemplified by the works of Raymond Chandler, Alfred Hitchcock, and the so-called film noir.

Major points of reference are numerous books published during the last decade on film noir, Alfred Hitchcock, and the American detective novel (by Lesley Brill, William Rothmann, etc.), and, concerning psychoanalytical theory, works by Fredric Jameson (The Political Unconscious), Mary Ann Doanne (The Desire to Desire), etc.

The underlying premise is that the works of Chandler, Hitchcock, etc., are far from simple entertainment: they give expression to the fundamental myths that determine the experience of what is usually referred to as "the American dream", and demonstrate its darker side. The method will be to follow a set of typical motifs through a series of selected works (family and maternal figures in Hitchcock's films; the status of women in Chandler's novels; the relation of the individual to destiny in film noir) and then to propose a psychoanalytical account of it, locating the studied phenomena into a wider social context.

The project will contribute to acquaintance with American culture in Yugoslavia; it will also participate directly in the current American theoretical debates. The result of the research will be a series of articles and a book, published in the USA and in Yugoslavia, covering the topic of the research.

Residence in the USA is necessary because of the access to literature and video material, and to enable interviews with living authors and theoreticians. The project can be completed within the time period requested because its scope is well defined and all the preparatory work has already been done (the topic is already for years part of the applicant's field of research; the applicant has already written and published numerous works on it).
